

The 5 Top Reasons to Study Psychology

1. Understanding Basic Psychological & Scientific Principles: scientific method, research methods and statistics

2. Critical thinking.

Critical thinking is considered to be essential to being an educated person, and is often a general education requirement in colleges. Psychology courses develop the critical thinking skills that are important in business, law, and other professions.

3. More Effective in the

Workplace. Industrial-Organizational Psychology

(one of the top-10 highest paying professions) focuses on understanding human dynamics in the workplace. A knowledge of human behavior is one of the 'selling points' for Psych majors when it comes to gaining employment, and a knowledge of basic psychology makes you a more effective supervisor/manager.


4. Understanding of Relationships and Well-Being.
